

## YUBA LAFCo NOTICE OF PROTEST HEARING

**Reclamation District 784: annexation of approximately 13,635 acres of territory and the detachment of approximately 4,467.57 acres from the district (Yuba LAFCo File No 2016-0002)**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Yuba Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCo) will hold a public protest hearing on **January 11, 2018 at the Board of Supervisor's Chambers at 915 8<sup>th</sup> Street, Marysville, California** to receive written protest against the annexation of approximately 13,635 acres of territory that will benefit from Flood Protection and the detachment of approximately 4,467.57 acres that will not, all territory is located within the southern part of the unincorporated area of Yuba County.

Owners of property and voters residing within the Reorganization territory may now file written protests against the proposal.

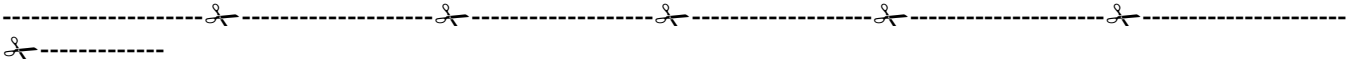
Proceedings for this proposal were initiated by the RD 784 on December 6, 2016. The Yuba Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCo) approved the proposal, which will be effective upon recordation of the Certificate of Completion. The hearing will **BEGIN at 9:00 a. m. on January 11, 2018**, at the Yuba County Board of Supervisor's Chambers located at 915 8<sup>th</sup> Street, Marysville, California. The hearing will **END at 9:15 a.m.** if no one appears to submit a written protest in person.

To be counted, protests must be in writing. They must be submitted before the close of the hearing, and they must be made by owners of land within the area and (or) by registered voters residing within the subject territory. A form is printed below for the convenience of anyone wishing to file a protest; it may be copied or filled in, detached, and returned to the LAFCo office.

Protests may be mailed to Yuba LAFCo, 915 8th Street, Suite 130, Marysville, CA 95901 **or** delivered to the LAFCo Executive Officer or his designee at the protest hearing. Each protest must clearly state whether it is made by a landowner or a registered voter or submitted for both and must include the name and address of the person submitting it and original signature. Landowner protests must also include a street address or parcel number identifying the location of the property in question. A registered voter's protest must show the voter's name and residence address as it appears on the affidavit of registration.

The value of protests received and not withdrawn before the hearing concludes will be determined within 30 days following the hearing in accordance with Government Code Section 57075. For more information, please call the LAFCo office at (530) 749-5467.
